WORSHIP NOTES

This morning violist *Sheila Browne* brings us the viola sonata by 19th-century Belgian composer Henri Vieuxtemps. Accompanied by Paul Fleckenstein at the piano, the three movements of the sonata will enhance our worship service as Prelude, Offertory and Postlude. In addition to a busy international performing career, Ms. Browne currently serves as professor of viola at the University of Delaware. Come prior to the 10 a.m. service to hear the Prelude.
