WORSHIP NOTES

This morning for the 4th week in our month-long series of major instrumental works in worship, we have a sonata for clarinet and piano by French composer Francis Poulenc. One might say this is a piece that “has it all” – from the humorous to the melancholy, and just about everything in-between. *Dr. Christopher Nichols*, our clarinet soloist, maintains an active schedule of performing and teaching, including his current position as Assistant Professor of Clarinet at the University of Delaware.
