Each year, our Christmas Offering is dedicated to furthering the mission of Christ and gives us the chance to share a portion of our abundant

blessings with people in dire circumstances. Every dollar you give goes beyond our walls to ministries that share the love of God with those in need. Will you help those in our community and in other troubled spots around the globe find hope?

Our Christmas Offering supports the dignity and empowerment of people all over the world by providing food, shelter, clean water, education, support services and peacemaking initiatives; 70% will enhance our local ministries and 30% will further our global ministries. Your gift will be distributed to the following:

- ♦ UrbanPromise Academy (30%) equips young adults from Wilmington neighborhoods (grades 9-12) with the skills necessary for academic achievement, life management, personal growth and servant leadership.
- Church in the World Projects (25%) programs that serve to educate girls and women in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Guatemala and Syrian refugee camps and support for the Guatemala (SWIG) water filter project.
- ♦ Emmanuel Dining Room (20%) provides hot, nutritious meals to those in our community who face increasing needs for emergency food assistance. Faithful and caring volunteers have been serving hundreds of meals at the North Jackson Street location each day since 1979.
- Friendship House Empowerment Centers (20%) helping individuals and families get back on a path of empowerment and self-sufficiency, this offering will help support the growth of the Empowerment Centers throughout New Castle County.
- Peace Drums (5%) a unique interfaith initiative promoting peace among Jewish, Christian, and Muslim youth living in the Galilee region of Israel.
