The children experience simple worship rituals and learn key stories in the Bible. They respond through crafts, songs and prayers.
- ❖ Godly Play 1 Children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade begin worship with their families. Following the Time with Our Children, they walk with their teachers to the Ruth Christie Room. The children learn the language of God's people through sacred space, stories, parables and liturgical actions. You may pick up your children in the **Preschool Suite Classroom C.**
- * Sing-to-Praise Choir Program Children in grades 3 through 6 begin worship with their families. Following the Time with Our Children, they meet their leaders in the pavilion and walk together to the Youth Music Room.

Parables of Jesus in Luke: A Video Series by Dr. Ken Bailey

Today's parable is "The Lost Younger Son". In this parable, Jesus turns conventional wisdom upside down and redefines the meaning of forgiveness. This four-week series, facilitated by Randy Williamson, is a continuation of a series started in October that focuses on Jesus as a Theologian through the study of selected parables from the Gospel of Luke. Each section will begin with a video presentation of Dr. Bailey providing his insights into the parable using his experience of living over 40 years in the Middle East.
