Gathering Time

"Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth."
- Psalm 46:10

As you enter this sacred space, we invite you into a time of Centering Prayer. You may choose a seat in the Chapel, sit at one of the tables in the Meeting Room, or claim a pillow from the window seat and find a comfortable spot on the floor. We encourage you to use the Mandala you received as a means of guided meditation. There are colored pencils on the tables in the Meeting Room and on the communion table. May this practice of contemplative coloring guide you deeper into God's presence and help you prepare your heart and mind for worship.

As you engage this spiritual discipline, you might reflect on the following questions: What burdens, concerns, expectations, or hopes do I bring with me into this sacred space? What must I leave behind in order to open myself to the Spirit's movement? What do I seek in this time of worship?

You may continue to color your Mandala throughout the service. When you are ready to offer your Mandala as a visual prayer to God, we invite you to pin it to the cross. Feel free to do so during a song, at the time of offering, or as you depart the Chapel at the end of worship.
