- ❖ Godly Care Children ages 2 4 begin in worship with their families. Following the Time with Children, they walk with a teacher to the **Preschool Suite** where they are greeted by the morning coordinator and escorted into Classroom C. The preschool curriculum is Cokesbury's Deep Blue and includes animated video family-themed Bible stories, active games, art, crafts, and music. Children discover how the stories can relate to our lives today.
- ❖ Godly Play 1 Children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade begin worship with their families. Following the Time with Children, they walk with their teachers to the Ruth Christie Room. The children learn the language of God's people through sacred space, stories, parables and liturgical actions. You may pick up your children in the **Preschool Suite Classroom C.**
- ❖ Sing-to-Praise Choir Program Children in grades 3 through 6 go to the Youth Music Room. Parents, please escort your child for sign-in, just prior to the start of worship, and pick up your child immediately following worship. Children will only be released to a parent or an adult pre-approved by the parent.

"My name is Sarah McBride and I am a proud transgender American," said the first openly transgender woman to address a national political convention. McBride's new book, *Tomorrow Will Be Different*, tells of growing up questioning her gender identity and coming out as trans during her senior year in college. As a political activist, McBride is largely credited with the passage of Delaware legislation banning discrimination on the basis of gender identity in employment, housing, insurance, and public accommodations. She currently serves as national press secretary of the Human Rights Campaign, where she continues to advocate for LGBTQ rights.

Why Should Peacemakers be Concerned about Palestine/Israel?

Tuesday, September 18 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. in Rodney Chapel


This is a presentation/discussion, led by **Dr. Rob Abel** and **Ms. Mike Abel**, on how the 70-year occupation of Palestine not only tramples human rights but denies the essence of Judaism, and why we as Americans – Jews, Muslims, Christians – should be concerned. Dr. Rob Abel is a Jewish-American ophthalmologist who has worked in Israel and the Arab world. Mike Abel is a Palestinian-American who has traveled extensively to the Middle East, West Bank and Gaza on peace and medical missions.



Adult Ed: Dead Sea Scrolls with Dr. Alan Fox

Dead Sea Scrolls (also Qumran Caves Scrolls) are ancient Jewish religious, mostly Hebrew, manuscripts found in the Qumran Caves near the Dead Sea. The texts have great historical, religious, and linguistic significance because they include the second-oldest known surviving manuscripts of works later included in the Hebrew Bible canon, along with deuterocanonical and extra-biblical manuscripts which preserve evidence of the diversity of religious thought in late Second Temple Judaism. Presented by **Alan Fox, Ph.D.**, Professor of Asian and Comparative Philosophy and Religion at the University of Delaware.



Strategies for Reducing Violence: Community and Law Enforcement Engagement

Saturday, September 29 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary

David Kennedy, author of *DON'T SHOOT: One Man, a Street Fellowship and the End of Violence in Inner-City America* and co-founder of the National Network for Safe Communities, will discuss proven strategic interventions to reduce violence and improve public safety, minimize arrest and incarceration, strengthen communities, and improve relationships between law enforcement and the communities it serves. **Wilmington Police Chief Robert Tracy** will also speak on emerging plans to implement elements of these strategies in Wilmington. *This is the second in a community-wide speaker series that began in September 2017 with Father Gregory Boyle of Homeboy Industries.*
