Children are always welcome in worship. We also provide additional opportunities for children to grow in faith.

- ❖ **Godly Care** – Children ages 2 – 4 begin in worship with their families. Following the Time with Our Children, they walk with a parent to the **Preschool Suite** where they are greeted by the morning coordinator and escorted into **Classroom A**. The children experience simple worship rituals and learn key stories in the Bible. They respond through crafts, songs and prayers.
- ❖ **Godly Play 1** – Children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade begin worship with their families. Following the Time with Our Children, they walk with their teachers to the Ruth Christie Room. The children learn the language of God’s people through sacred space, stories, parables and liturgical actions. You may pick up your children in the **Preschool Suite Classroom C**.
- ❖ **Sing-to-Praise Choir Program** – Children in grades 3 through 6 begin worship with their families. Following the Time with Our Children, they walk with their teachers to the Youth Music Room. Children will only be released to a parent or an adult pre-approved by the parent.

Humanitarian Rights for All

Tuesday, September 19, 7:00 p.m., Wilmington Friends Meetinghouse, 401 N. West St.

Bill Frelick, son of Dr. Robert Frelick, will speak as part of a Pacem in Terris speaker program. He is Director, of the Refugee Rights Program at *Human Rights Watch* where he monitors, investigates, and documents human rights abuses against refugees, asylum seekers, and internally displaced persons, and advocates for the rights and humanitarian needs.

A presentation and discussion covering why advocates for peace and justice support the end of the Israeli occupation of Palestine. His mission is supporting human rights for all Palestinians, freedom of speech, and ending settlements in Israel.
