

People with records face barriers when seeking employment, housing, educational opportunities, credit, and much more. With up to 40% of Delawareans having a record, expungements are needed to ensure we leave no one behind in our nation's economic recovery. Although expungement eligibility was expanded in 2019, Clean Slate Delaware seeks to automate the process of eligible expungements so more Delawareans will actually benefit from a second chance. John Reynolds from the ACLU of Delaware will talk about the expungement issue and the initiative to pass Clean Slate legislation. 



