# OPERATION ALLIES WELCOME: A Conversation between Governor Markell and Senator McBride

Sunday, January 9, 10 a.m. in the sanctuary



On Sunday, January 9, we will have a unique opportunity to learn about the Afghan refugee resettlement program. Immediately following the 9:00 service, State Senator and Westminster member Sarah McBride will speak with Jack Markell, who served as Governor of Delaware from 2009 to 2017 and is now the White House Coordinator for Operation Allies Welcome. Former Governor Markell and Senator McBride will discuss this project, which supports vulnerable Afghans as they resettle in the United States. Join us in the sanctuary or via the livestream to hear their conversation and learn about this important issue.

# **COVID-19 Mask Policy and Safety Measures**

Mask Policy and Sanctuary Seating. Masks are required inside the building, including in entryways, hallways, the staff wing, Rodney Chapel, and *all* areas of the sanctuary. Masks must fully cover the nose and mouth. This change was made by Session on November 22, 2021 in order to allow congregational singing. By wearing masks, we protect our children who are not yet vaccinated and our members who are immune compromised. In addition, it adheres to the guidelines of the American Choral Directors Association.

As of Sunday, December 12, we have reversed seating in the sanctuary. To provide a safe place for our young children and our immune-compromised adults, we are moving the social distance section to the front of the sanctuary and the side transepts. Those who are comfortable sitting closer to one another will sit in the back half of the sanctuary and the balcony.

**Safety Measures.** We are committed to your safety during the pandemic. No-touch hand sanitizing stations are located near the doors and in the hallways. The sanctuary, Rodney Chapel, the main hallway and the staff wing are all equipped with the same high grade air filters as in hospitals plus air purifying devices that use needle-point bi-polar ionization on the air handlers that operate in these areas. These devices break down viruses, bacteria, mold, allergens, smoke, and odors in the air. These devices, along with the fact that we have a very high vaccination rate among our worshipers, makes Westminster one of the safest environments you can find.






