COVID-19 Mask Policy and Safety Measures

Mask Policy. Masks are required inside the building, including in entryways, hallways, the staff wing, Rodney Chapel, and all areas of the sanctuary. Masks must fully cover the nose and mouth. This change was made by Session on November 22, 2021 in order to allow congregational singing. By wearing masks, we protect our children who are not yet vaccinated and our members who are immune compromised. In addition, it adheres to the guidelines of the American Choral Directors Association.

If you have children too young to be vaccinated, you are welcome to worship in the sanctuary or Rodney Chapel, but we have also created a safe, kid-friendly space called the **Prayground**. This worship space is in Community Hall on Sundays from 9 to 9:45 a.m. We livestream our worship service into Community Hall and provide materials to help young children engage in worship. Masking (for those over age 2) and social distancing is required.

Safety Measures. We are committed to your safety during the pandemic. No-touch hand sanitizing stations are located near the doors and in the hallways. The sanctuary, Rodney Chapel, the main hallway and the staff wing are all equipped with the same high grade air filters as in hospitals plus air purifying devices that use needle-point bi-polar ionization on the air handlers that operate in these areas. These devices break down viruses, bacteria, mold, allergens, smoke, and odors in the air. These devices, along with the fact that we have a very high vaccination rate among our worshipers, makes Westminster one of the safest environments you can find.



Planners of the U.S. interstate highway system routed some highways directly, and

sometimes purposefully, through Black and brown communities. The construction of I-95 through Wilmington resulted in the destruction of 360+ homes between Adams and Jackson Streets. It effectively created a wall between the West Side neighborhood and the downtown area and substantially increased traffic on these two streets. To address this historic inequity, Wilmington is joining an ever-growing number of cities exploring ways to reconnect neighborhoods and provide new public spaces by creating caps over urban highways. 


