Today we hear a stirring arrangement of *Ain'a That Good News!* by William Dawson (1899–1990). Although the Alabama native is best remembered for his choral arrangements, it's important to note that he made significant contributions to chamber and symphonic repertoire as well. His *Negro Folk Symphony* garnered the attention of Leopold Stowkowski and was premiered by the Philadelphia Orchestra in 1934.




## Bible Box for Young Children Resumes February 14




