


Socially Distanced Hike Saturday, July 18, 9:00 – 10:00 a.m.

DRAW IT

In Matthew 13, Jesus tells the Parable of the Sower. He compares people's hearts to different kinds of soil - a path, rocky soil, thorny soil, and good soil. **Draw the seeds falling on these different places. Remember the good soil represents a heart that receives God's word and follows it!**
