Today's Music: The fully vaccinated and masked Westminster Choir will lead our hymns. Beginning today, the congregation is invited to join the hymn singing! The anthem was composed by Paul Laubengayer using a text by Thomas Troeger, the Professor of Christian Communication at the Yale Divinity School and a well-known preacher, poet, and musician. Troeger has authored more than 20 books; his work appears in the hymnals of most denominations and is frequently set as choral anthems. Today's anthem text comes from *Borrowed Light* (Oxford University Press, 1994).

COVID-19 Mask Policy and Safety Measures

Mask Policy. Masks are required inside the building, including in entryways, hallways, the staff wing, Rodney Chapel, and *all* areas of the sanctuary. Masks must fully cover the nose and mouth. This change was made by Session on November 22, 2021 in order to allow congregational singing. By wearing masks, we protect our children who are not yet vaccinated and our members who are immune compromised. In addition, it adheres to the guidelines of the American Choral Directors Association.

If you have children too young to be vaccinated, you are welcome to worship in the sanctuary or Rodney Chapel, but we have also created a safe, kid-friendly space called the **Prayground**. This worship space is in Community Hall on Sundays from 9 to 9:45 a.m. We livestream our worship service into Community Hall and provide materials to help young children engage in worship. Masking (for those over age 2) and social distancing is required.

Safety Measures. We are committed to your safety during the pandemic. No-touch hand sanitizing stations are located near the doors and in the hallways. The sanctuary, Rodney Chapel, the main hallway and the staff wing are all equipped with the same high grade air filters as in hospitals plus air purifying devices that use needle-point bi-polar ionization on the air handlers that operate in these areas. These devices break down viruses, bacteria, mold, allergens, smoke, and odors in the air. These devices, along with the fact that we have a very high vaccination rate among our worshipers, makes Westminster one of the safest environments you can find.

In recent weeks, three high profile criminal trials – in Kenosha, WI; Brunswick, GA;




