We welcome to our pulpit the Rev. Dr. William D. Hess II, who is a native of the Pittsburgh area and a Penn State graduate. He is a lifelong Presbyterian and holds three theological degrees from Ashland, Princeton, and Pittsburgh seminaries. Bill has served congregations in Ohio, Allentown, Mckeesport, and for 26 years at First Presbyterian Church, West Chester, from which he retired and for which he is Pastor Emeritus. He has also served as a Transitional Pastor for conflicted congregations in Downingtown, Swarthmore, Media, and Bethlehem. As a Rotarian and Paul Harris Fellow, Bill and Bev have hosted 16 high school students through the Youth Exchange program. Bill has been active in mission relationships in Villa Nueva, Guatemala, Mthatha, South Africa, and Mysore, India. Bev and Bill have been married for 51 years and have three adult children and six grandchildren.

Dr. Jones is preaching at the historic Bay Head Chapel in Bay Head, New Jersey this morning.

The Music: The soloist is Margaret Mezzacappa, our alto section leader in the Westminster Choir. The Ohio native rose to prominence in the opera world as the Grand Prize Winner of the 2012 Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions. A graduate of Philadelphia's Academy of Vocal Arts, she has performed with Opera Philadelphia, Opera New Jersey, San Francisco Opera, the Philadelphia Orchestra, Columbus Symphony, Phoenix Symphony, Allentown Symphony, and with the Germantown Oratorio Choir & Orchestra. In addition, we are honored to welcome internationally acclaimed concert pianist and Steinway Artist Gayle Martin back to Westminster. The Houston native has given solo performances and appeared with orchestras around the world. She achieved international prominence as the sole American laureate in the sixth International Tchaikovsky Piano Competition in Moscow—the third American woman ever to reach the finals. Gayle is a Juilliard graduate where she was one of the last students of the famed pedagogue Rosina Lhévinne. We are blessed to have these talented ladies sharing their gifts in worship today.
