The Music: We welcome Luigi Mazzocchi back to Westminster as our instrumental soloist today. Mr. Mazzocchi is the Concertmaster of the Philadelphia Ballet Orchestra, the Lancaster Symphony, the Black Pearl Chamber Orchestra, and the Ocean City Pops Orchestra; he is also Associate Concertmaster of the Delaware Symphony and a member of Opera Philadelphia, the Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia, the West Jersey Chamber Orchestra, the NoName Pops, the Pyxis Piano Trio, and Camerata Philadelphia. Luigi is an artistic director of Artcinia and has served as substitute violinist and a teaching artist for the Philadelphia Orchestra. He has also performed with the Philly Pops, Orchestra 2001, the Philadelphia Classical Symphony, the Serafin and Dalí String Quartets, the Pagode Project, and Alô Brasil. The Venezuela native studied violin with Liliana Ciulei and Helen Kwalwasser at Rowan and Temple Universities and is a prizewinning soloist in the U.S., Latin America, and Puerto Rico.

Our vocal soloist is Rebecca Hughes, our soprano section leader in the Westminster Choir. The Delaware County native has received critical praise for her "voice of rare beauty and exceptional power." Rebecca is a graduate of Temple University where she majored in voice and was a student of Benita Valente. She is a regular soloist at Westminster and has been a featured soloist with the Germantown Oratorio Choir & Orchestra in Philadelphia.

We are blessed to have these extraordinary musicians sharing their gifts in worship today.
