

Slavonic Dances, Op. 72

Antonín Dvořák (1841–1904)

No. 5 in B-flat Minor [Špacĭrka] No. 6 in B-flat Major [Starodávný]

The Špacírka is a moderately fast Bohemian dance in 2/4 time. The dance starts out slowly with the dancer(s) walking; it is from this that the dance got its name: in Czech "špacírovat" (coming from the German word Spazieren) means "to walk around." The word "starodávný" has a rich and complex meaning that is difficult to translate. It refers to someone or something that recalls a cherished memory. This Czech dance is associated with the northeastern Czech region of Moravia, existing as both a couple or group dance, and is a walking dance that includes rocking and turning motions. Some think it is related to the Polish polonaise.

Grand Rondo in A Major, Op. 107 (D 951)

Franz Schubert (1797–1828)

Schubert's *Rondo in A* was composed in the last year of his life. Robert Schumann, in a letter to Friederich Wieck, mentioned playing the Rondo, "which I number among his finest creations — or show me anything comparable to this calm, lowering thunderstorm, to this tremendous, tranquil, lyrical madness and the whole of the deep, gentle, ethereal melancholy that hovers above the work in its entirety." Alfred Einsten called it "the apotheosis of all Schubert compositions for four hands."

From Six Morceaux, Op. 11

Sergei Rachmaninoff (1873–1943)

No. 2. Scherzo No. 4. Waltz

The Op. 11 six-movement *Suite* for four hands was composed in 1894 and is Rachmaninoff's most significant contribution to piano duet literature.

Dialog for Organ and Piano

Leo Sowerby (1895–1968)

Sowerby wrote several duets for organ and piano, of which the jazzy *Dialog*, composed in 1967, has been perhaps the most popular.

These two contrasting movements by an active composer more well-known for her choral compositions demonstrate her own considerable keyboard prowess and were composed in 1992.

Mephisto Waltz No. 1

Franz Liszt (1811–1886)

The inspiration for Liszt's orchestral tone poem was Nikolaus Lenau's telling of the story of Faust. The waltz programmatically depicts a scene at the village inn where Mephistopheles in the form of a huntsman enters with Faust and seduces a maiden and the entire party to a bacchanalian dance into the forest. This arrangement for piano four hands is by the composer.


The **Birk and Hoke Duo** performs in a variety of venues playing four-hand piano, four-hand organ, and piano and organ repertoire. The duo of Eric Birk and Bernadette Hoke has appeared in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, and Texas. As winners of the Artist International Competition, they were presented in a debut recital at Weill Hall at Carnegie Hall and an additional performance at Merkin Concert Hall in New York City. The *New York Concert Review* wrote of their debut performance, "The husband-and-wife duo played with precision that never impinged on fluid ease."

In the autumn of 2008, they were the featured pianists on a concert at the Jewish Museum entitled, "Bernstein: A Jewish Legacy." This concert was part of the New York City celebration of the 90th anniversary of the birth of Leonard Bernstein: "The Best of All Possible Worlds." The duo has also performed as guest artists at the Baylor University Mid-Winter Organ Conference and at St. Paul's Chapel, the Brick Presbyterian Church, and the Church of St. Mary the Virgin in NYC.

Bernadette Hoke performs each year in concert and recital with a variety of vocalists, instrumentalists, and chamber groups. Ms. Hoke is the Music Director and Organist of the Saint Albans Church in NYC. While at

the Saint Albans school, she founded and directed the Saint Albans Schola, a select group of students that performed in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. In addition to the semi-professional choir she conducts at the church, in the fall of 2019 she was appointed conductor of the two New York City choruses of Encore Chorale. Ms. Hoke earned a Master of Music degree from the Manhattan School of Music and holds the Associate certificate of the American Guild of Organists.

Eric Birk frequently serves as guest accompanist and substitute organist/choir director in various churches in the New York City area. A native of Texas, he is a graduate of Baylor University (Bachelor of Music, magna cum laude) and Manhattan School of Music (Master of Music) with degrees in piano performance. His organ teachers included Joyce Jones and Walter Hilse, and he earned the Fellowship Certificate of the American Guild of Organists in 2014. Eric most recently served as organist and choirmaster at Christ & St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in 2022 and 2023 and was interim minister of music and organist of the Brick Presbyterian Church in the summer of 2021.


