Our Christmas Offering bolsters the work of Christ as we empower our brothers and sisters worldwide, shelter and support individuals and families experiencing homelessness or moving from transitional housing, and work for peace in the Middle East. Every dollar you give goes beyond our walls to ministries that share the love of God with those in need. This year, your gifts will be distributed to:

- ♦ Church in the World Projects (25%) Global programs in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Guatemala, and Palestine that promote peace, provide humanitarian assistance, and offer sustainable income opportunities for those in poverty. Education and empowerment for women and girls is also supported by this Christmas offering.
- Friendship House (20%) A Wilmington organization supporting those facing houselessness (loss of one's physical residence) and homelessness (loss of community) through programs which include the Clothing Bank, Empowerment Centers, Code Purple, Code Orange, Financial Assistance, and Transitional Housing.
- → Habitat for Humanity (20%) Habitat for Humanity in New Castle County builds affordable housing with 0% interest mortgages for qualified individuals. Habitat's reach includes critical home repairs for low-income homeowners, disaster assistance, neighborhood beautification projects, and advocacy/education for positive change in communities.
- ♦ New Life Furnishings (20%) A ministry of Westminster housed on our campus provides furniture and household goods to individuals with limited resources who are moving from transitional housing and programs into independent living. All individuals are vetted by our social service partners.
- 1in7B Foundation (10%) This relatively new Wilmington non-profit provides basic needs for homeless individuals via its MobileServ ministry. Mobile shower and laundry services are available at two locations; meals and hospitality are shared by volunteers.
- Churches for Middle East Peace (5%) A coalition of more than 30 national church denominations and organizations, including PC(USA), that works to encourage U.S. policies that promote a comprehensive resolution to conflicts in the Middle East, particularly those in Israel/Palestine. Westminster is an active participant in these efforts.
