The Music: Our service music includes works by living composers. Michael Joncas is an internationally recognized priest, liturgical composer, author, speaker, and professor who has composed more than 20 collections of liturgical music. Aaron David Miller is Director of Music and Organist at House of Hope Presbyterian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota. He has dozens of sacred choral works in print, including our offertory anthem today. Carson Cooman is Composer in Residence at The Memorial Church, Harvard University. His catalog of works includes many forms—from solo instrumental pieces to operas, and from orchestral works to hymn tunes. His music has been performed on all six inhabited continents in venues that range from the stage of Carnegie Hall to the basket of a hot air balloon. The Westminster Choir welcomes new members to all sections.
