The Music: The music of John Stainer is largely forgotten and rarely heard today. The British composer and organist lived at the end of the nineteenth century and made large contributions to the choral repertory. His best-known work, *The Crucifixion*, is an oratorio based on the biblical narrative of the Passion story. "God So Loved the World" is beloved by church choirs and sung around the globe. Stainer was organist at St. Paul's Cathedral in London and died on Palm Sunday at the age of 60 in 1901.

The chancel flowers are given to the Glory of God and in memory of Jerry Lee, by Virginia Lee and family.
